

How to Apply

Our website allows you to apply online and to download the complete application package. As well, we require the last two years of school transcripts and of the current year to date. A letter of introduction written in English by the student, and addressed to the District Principal, helps us to

know the student a little better and is one more piece of information to understand what level of English support we will put in place at the school.



The District Principal will look to see that each student has the academic and social potential to be successful and will place the student in the school that best matches their needs. If basic knowledge of English is low we will recommend attendance in one or more of our highly successful summer programs.

Our four intake dates – September, November, February, April - for the regular school year program offers maximum flexibility!

Most students arrive for the start of our regular school year and you will enjoy a comprehensive welcome and orientation program.

Become part of a Canadian Family!

All families are under the supervision of the District Principal and the Homestay Supervisor.

Each student receives treatment as if they were the natural child of the host parents. You will:

- Be matched as best possible to your needs and per your specific requests
- Speak English at all times
- Participate in all family events
- Have your own room
- \checkmark Have three meals a day plus snacks
- Have access to the internet
- Be transported to the activities and hobbies you have outside of school time



- Have your host parents advocate for you with the school staff
- Have your host parents help with personal banking, signing up for activities, completing forms for the school and for the international program



Our Schools are top rated!

Canada's education system is ranked in the top 5 of all countries in the world. BC is always ranked top 3 in Canada. Our students are taught by BC Government certified teachers.

We are able to place elementary students (Kindergarten through grade 7) in our elementary schools provided they are accompanied by an adult relative.

In our middle and secondary schools, and like all students in British Columbia, our students have access to all courses in the curriculum plus Hockey, Golf, Outdoor Education and Tourism Academies. Furthermore, there are many courses in the arts, business, media, technical trades and physical education and athletics.

Short term programs!

We accept individual students and groups and will tailor the program to match your specific needs. Programs are from 2 weeks and up to 8 weeks in length. Elementary age students are welcome in homestay for these short term programs.

Individual Winter program students typically request full integration and we are able to meet this need. With small groups of 10-14 students, we are also able to structure a series of cultural and recreational activities at your request – contact the District Principal.



Our Summer programs are very successful and full detail is included on our website. We use the instructional practice of learning English in the context of meaningful events. Therefore, every day of the program has a trip into the community of some kind. Then the instruction the following day has at least partial focus on that experience. The July program has many more activities while the August Program focuses on transition into the regular school startup in September.
